Butler County Farmers Federation - The Butler County Farmers Federation has established a scholarship program that will offer several scholarships to graduates from Butler County High Schools. The maximum amount of each scholarship shall be \$500 for applicants who enroll in a Community College or trade or technical school and \$1000 for applicants who enroll in a four-year college or university. The amount of the award will be issued one-half per calendar year.

Eligibility:

1. Applicant's parent, guardian, or grandparent must have been a member of the Alabama Farmers Federation for two years prior to applying.
2. Must have graduated from one of the Butler County High Schools or the Alabama Mathematics and Science School.

3. Students who plan to attend a four-year college or university must be unconditionally admitted to the college or university of their choice. Those who plan to attend a community college or trade or technical school, must have a minimum 1.8 GPA.
4. A general statement of financial need is requested.
5. Selection of applicants shall be based on need, aspirations, school and community activities, and scholastic achievements.

Dear Student:

In order to apply for scholarship with The Baptist Foundation of Alabama, the following qualifications and requirements must be met:

Qualifications

- Applicant is to be a bona fide resident of the State of Alabama.
- Applicant is to be a member in good standing of a Southern Baptist Church cooperating with the Alabama Baptist State Convention. (Seminary applicant is to be a member of a Southern Baptist church cooperating with the Southern Baptist Convention.)
- Applicant is to be classified as a full time student according to the school's current catalog.
- Applicant must have and maintain a 2.0 GPA.
- The Baptist Foundation of Alabama awards [scholarships](#) on an annual basis. **All students must reapply each year. Scholarships are not renewable – Students must reapply each year to be eligible.**

Please note that all documents should be scanned electronically and submitted [online](#) as a part of the application process. If students do not have scanning capabilities, documents may be mailed to The Foundation; however, scanned electronic document submission is strongly encouraged. A student's application IS NOT complete unless all documents are attached and the [application](#) is submitted no later than midnight, March 31. Students whose online applications are incomplete in any way after March 31 will NOT be eligible to be awarded a scholarship. All additional attachments postmarked after March 31 will NOT be considered eligible for scholarships.

It is the responsibility of the applicant to complete all requirements. Failure to notify The Foundation of a school change once the application is submitted may result in loss of an awarded scholarship.

NOTE: The Foundation will communicate with applicants primarily through email. It is the applicant's responsibility to check their email regularly (including spam folder) for reminders, application questions, application rejections, application acceptances, and final award results. Failure to check email may result in loss of a potential [award](#).

FORT DALE CLUB – SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITY FOR SENIOR ATHLETES

Eligibility requirements for the athletic scholarships are as follows:

1. Parent must actively participate in at least one major fundraiser and must attend a minimum of four (4) meetings throughout the school year.
2. Scholarship applicants must participate in at least one (1) sport at Fort Dale, including but not limited to dance, cheer, football, volleyball, basketball, baseball, tennis, soccer and/or track and field (water girls that do not participate in the sports listed may be eligible if they complete the summer workout program). Children and Spouses of Eligible Alabama Veterans

Type: Grant

Award: \$1000 annually

Eligibility: Children and spouses of eligible Alabama veterans who attend public post-secondary educational institutions in Alabama

Deadline: Not specified

Administered by: Alabama Commission on Higher Education

As of Fall 2009, children and stepchildren of **qualified veterans** may receive five standard academic years (10 semesters) at any Alabama state-supported institution of higher learning or a prescribed course of study at any state-supported technical school without payment of any tuition, mandatory textbooks or instructional fees.

This nationally renowned program was created by Act 633 and approved October 1947 by the Alabama Legislature. It is administered by the Alabama Department of Veterans Affairs and is governed by the Code of Alabama 1975, Section 31-6-1. The veteran must meet the following qualifications to establish eligibility of his/her dependents. A dependent is defined as a child, stepchild, spouse or the un-remarried widow(er) of the veteran.
